





What is IUFP?

IUFP is a six months to one-year full-time University Pathway course, which offer students an alternative entry route to leading Universities across 5 Continents (Africa, Australia, MiddleEast, North-America and Europe) for degree courses.

The programme is aimed at international students, seeking direct admittance at leading Universities without the need to undertake a two-year GCE 'A' Level course The IUFP is tried and tested as it has been around for more than 12 years. Several IUFP Alumni at IUFP Partner Schools are testament to this fact since 2010.

Within three (3) months after commencement of the IUFP at any of our Partner Schools, IUFP students will secure a Conditional Offer Letter of admission from at least one of the Universities that have signed Progression Agreements for the IUFP

How long does the course last?

The IUFP is designed to be completed over a period of one academic year (9 months) for the Standard Scheme, though students enrolled on the Intensive Scheme can complete the course in six months (usually between January and June).







What are the admissions criteria?

Prospective IUFP students must have completed Secondary or High School. They must possess 5 Credits at GCSE 'O' Level standard (or equivalent) which must include English language and Mathematics. IUFP students must be at least 16 years old, though applicants desiring to progress to University of Greenwich must be at least 15 years old at the start of the IUFP course at a Partner School.

How is the course assessed?

The programme is assessed at the end of the academic year by written examinations (2 hours unseen paper for Core Subjects and 3 hours for Elective Subjects)

Are English lessons required as part of the course?

The Academic English module of the course is designed to improve the English language competence of IUFP students in readiness for their degree studies at University. Students undertaking the IUFP are required to obtain an Overall Band Score of 6.5 (6.0 in each sub-test of Speaking, Listening, Reading and Writing) of IELTS by the time they complete the IUFP if they wish to progress to universities in Australia, Canada, Mauritius or UAE. Otherwise, if they wish to progress to UK universities, their Credit grade in English language in WAEC or NECO is deemed by some (not all) of our university partners in UK as sufficient in meeting the English language criteria. For applicants wishing to progress to University of Hertfordshire or St. Mary's University, Twickenham, London in UK, **IELTS** is required



Examinations are held twice a year in June and December.








Where are the examinations held?
